Lunchtime

Mrs Parker has spent some time this term reviewing lunchtimes with staff and children. This week in assembly, Mrs Parker has shared this feedback with the children and launched a new plan for clubs at lunchtime so that children can access 20 minutes of their lunch to play games, play with construction, read, colour, sing and more. This is in addition to outdoor play, big games outside and the allotment. There is a timetable in place for lunchtime clubs that are available to children across the week with a set number of tickets per class per week, so that clubs are manageable. Year 5 and 6 have an opportunity to take on the role of 'Lunchtime Friends' and will support a variety of activities and tasks over the lunchtime.
