

# Homework Guidelines

As part of the Home - School Agreement, all partners in the school - children, staff, governors and parents - agree to support the school in the child's education.

It is vital that children establish a workable homework routine where regular homework is seen by them as part of their education.

The Government provides clear guidelines on homework, which focus on numeracy and literacy, and the school's homework policy is based on this.

Children are provided with a homework book and a Reading Record Book which they are expected to look after and bring to school on the required days.

- Advise parents/carers of any concerns or problems affecting their child's work or behaviour
- Arrange meetings with parents/carers to discuss their child's progress
- Contact parents/carers if there is a problem with attendance or punctuality
- Set and monitor homework
- Communicate with respect and courtesy

- See that my child arrives at school on time, attends regularly, is properly equipped and wears the correct uniform
- Support my child's learning by helping with homework and providing other opportunities for home learning
- Support the school's organisation of classes and pupils
- Support the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour and attendance
- Let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect my child's work or behaviour
- Contact the school at the beginning of each day of my child's absence, so the school is not concerned about their safety or whereabouts
- Support my child by attending parents' evenings and discussions about my child's progress
- Become involved in school activities and school life
- Communicate with respect and courtesy
