# HEMINGFORD GREY PRIMARY SCHOOL GOVERNING BODY CURRICULUM COMMITTEE TERMS OF REFERENCE

# **Membership and operational matters**

- The Committee shall consist of at least four Governors, including, where possible, the SEND Link Governor.
- The Chair shall be elected annually at the first meeting of the academic year.
- Members of the teaching staff and other Governors shall attend as the need arises.
- The quorum shall be three Governors plus the Headteacher or their delegated representative.
- The Committee will report back to the Governing Body on all delegated decisions it makes on the Governing Body's behalf.
- The Committee shall meet at least termly.

#### The Role of the Curriculum Committee

The Curriculum Committee will be responsible for helping the school staff in developing and delivering a curriculum that meets both national requirements and the aims and vision of the school, and reviewing that such development and delivery are maintained in accordance with the School Improvement Plan.

## The Curriculum Committee will make decisions on behalf of the Governing body on:

- Strategic developments within the curriculum
- the provision for sex and relationship education
- arrangements for religious education and collective worship
- the approval and review of the Behaviour Policy
- the timing of school sessions
- ensuring the statutory requirements of assessment, recording and reporting are met
- Reviewing delegated policies.
- monitoring and reviewing the progress of school priorities including those in the School Improvement Plan (SIP)
- monitoring the implementation of the Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) Policy in conjunction with the SENDCO and taking account of all relevant legislation
- ensuring, in conjunction with Governors and members of the teaching staff, that the National Curriculum is taught to all pupils and consider any disapplications
- agreeing the annual statutory and non-statutory pupil performance targets and monitoring and reviewing progress
- monitoring and reviewing the progress and achievement of all groups of pupils
- monitor the use of funding to support specific groups of pupils or curriculum areas e.g.pupil premium funding
- receiving reports from staff involved in the management of the whole school curriculum

## The Curriculum Committee will make recommendations to the Governing Body on:

 all curriculum policies which require full governing body approval, as recorded in the current Policy Schedule
