



Reading books

Please ensure that your child brings their reading book and reading record to school <u>every</u> <u>day</u>. Please read at least 5 times a week with your child and sign the box in the reading record.

Spelling Homework

Spellings will be given every week on a Friday. These will be stuck into a small red book. They will be tested the following Friday. During the week the children will have daily independent tasks to complete that are related to these spellings. Your child will also have three 20 minute sessions per week to focus on these spellings and understand how to spell and use the words in context.

Maths Homework and Times tables

EACH FRIDAY your child will be bringing maths homework home. This will be set by the maths teacher who is teaching your child.

The tasks will relate to the maths that has been taught in class and are designed to challenge the children to apply their understanding.

A times table sheet will also be attached to practise a focus multiplication fact.

You can find the list of the times tables in the back of your child's reading record and you can tick the stages of where your child is in their learning at the back e.g. step 1 - chant the times tables, step 2 - say the number sentences and step 3 - know them.

Our aim is that most Year 4 children should be able to recall all the times tables facts by the end of the year.

P.E.
