## Reporting results: Scaled scores

* Parents and schools will be presented with a scaled score
* A scaled score of 100 will represent the 'expected standard'
* A pupil's scaled score will be based on their raw score and it will be translated into a scaled score using a conversion table
* The scaled score will be reported alongside whether your child met the expected standard.
* There is no requirement for the submission of teacher assessment in reading and maths.
* Example:

## Organisation

* Breakfast snack provided
* Tests start at 9.30am
* Children split throughout the zone to provide space
* Children CAN ask to have questions read to them
* Adults cannot support in how to answer the question
* Children eligible may have extra-time or a reader


## Support at school - after half term

* Before school
- Time to complete focussed tasks e.g. spelling, grammar, reading, maths, writing
* Teacher led maths groups 8.15-8.45 - all children allocated two days
* Optional grammar session with Mrs Read - allocated one slot
* No sessions on a Friday


## Support at home

* Encourage and support children with homework routine will help to be secondary school ready
* Ask arithmetic questions which can be answered mentally or have a revision pad of paper for jottings

* Read a range of text types - ask questions
