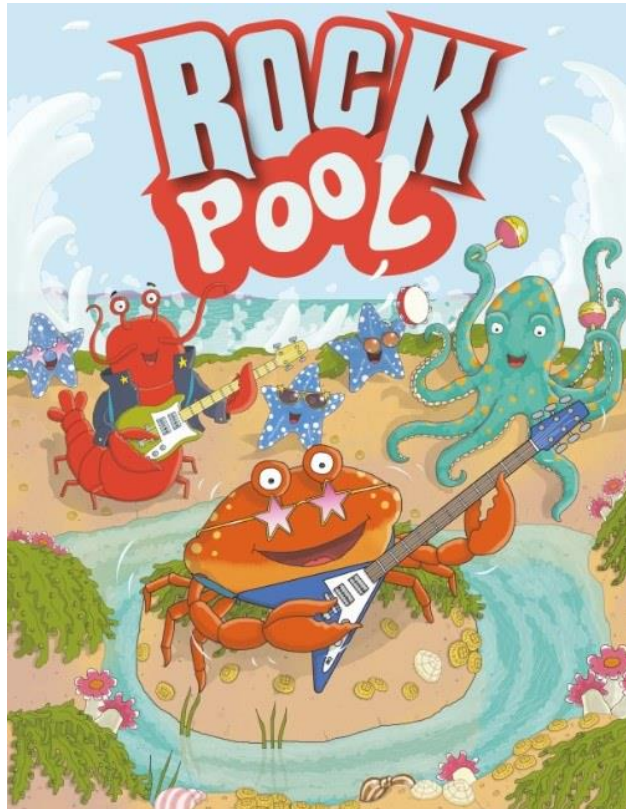


Hemingford Grey Primary School Newsletter 19th May 2023



Mrs Marriott News Update:

A huge well done to our Year 2 pupils this week who have maturity and focus for their KS1 SATS. Well done Year 2! After the half term holiday the Year 4 pupils take their Multiplication tests and Year 1 take

their Phonics Test. These assessments, along with SATs are statutory tests which all maintained schools deliver. In addition our pupils take termly assessment papers called NFER tests. The outcomes are viewed alongside the work produced in class and teachers make a final teacher assessment each term which is recorded in our school data system. Each term, teachers and leaders meet together in Pupil Progress meetings to discuss pupil's learning and plan ahead for any additional support that is required.

Many children across the school access the various clubs on offer. These do change across the year dependant on weather conditions. Currently at lunchtimes there are the following clubs running: drawing, football, Lego and Eco-Committee. Before/After school we have Hemingford Harriers Running, Anstey Art, Dance, Forest School and WhizzKids. All after school club providers can offer a limited number of spaces to pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium, so if your child meets this criterion and would like to join a club in the future, please do request a funded space.
